



Laadliyan Improving Lives

From laadli care packages, to resources, to events, throughout 2021, Laadliyan strived to improve the lives of South Asian girls and women.

→ The Udaari Project

The pandemic has heavily impacted the International Student Population living, working and studying in Peel Region. From providing access to health, legal and employment related information, adequate housing, to providing essentials such as food, clothing and hygiene products, we have done it all!

In 2021, we directly supported **191 international students** with grocery gift cards, winter clothing, health related products and services, home essentials, academic and professional development support. This support is valued at **\$41,183.20**

🛰 Laadli to Laadli

Making connections during 2021 became even more important as people were isolated and unable to do traditional networking. Our Laadli to Laadli Mentorship Program saw a great rise in mentor applications from professional South Asian women who wanted to give back to their younger sisters in the community. We made a total of **52 connections** between mentors and mentees.

Through Laadli to Laadli, we also had the opportunity to virtually conduct workshops and seminars with 3 local high schools in the Region of Peel resulting in 4 workshops and **88 high school students** impacted! A special thank you to Judith Nyman Secondary School, North Park Secondary School and Humberview Secondary school for inviting us to speak with your students!

Biji & Me

Our Biji & Me program provides South Asian grandmothers and granddaughters spaces to connect and share knowledge while decreasing the generational gap that exists.

This beloved program remained virtual for 2021 while we offered participants the same level of support and energy. Workshops included yoga for grandmothers and granddaughters, jewellery making, Health and Wellness education and of course dancing! For each workshop, participants were delivered supplies and treats thanks to you our amazing volunteers.

Laadli Care Packages

Our Laadli Care Package provides essential menstrual hygiene items to those most in need in our community. In 2021, we saw an increase in need for menstrual hygiene products in women's shelters, food banks and international students. Through collaborative efforts with our community, we donated a total of 800 Laadli Care packages valued at \$17,600

We ended the year with our annual holiday drive and packaging party where we collected donations worth **\$4500** and packaged 200 laadli care packages with support from our amazing community!
